Fingerprint Leads to Burglary Suspect in Winder

The City of Winder Police Department responded to a burglary call on Sunday May 8th, 2016 at approximately 4:00pm at the Amedisys home health care business located on Piedmont Drive. Several food items had been taken and items inside the building had been thrown all over the floor.

On Monday May 9th at approximately 8:00am, Winder Officers responded to another burglary call at the Department of Juvenile Justice building located on Lee Street. It appeared as though a set of keys had been stolen from the building.

No suspects were developed at the time but officers processed each scene for any potential evidence. The items that were collected were brought back to the police department. The department's crime scene investigator was later able to lift a fingerprint from an item that was retrieved. The print was run through the department's Integrated Automated Fingerprint Identification System (IAFIS) and returned to 26 year old Toumua Lor of Auburn Georgia.

A criminal history was run on Lor and it was discovered that he had just been arrested, since the two burglaries had been committed, by the Barrow County Sheriff's Office on numerous other unrelated charges and was currently incarcerated. A Winder Police detective interviewed Lor at the Barrow County jail and determined that enough probable cause existed to request two arrest warrants against him that were obtained on May 19th, one for each incident of burglary. Lor is still currently being held at the Barrow County Detention Center for both agencies and is awaiting bond.
